Mumbai, 29 September 2021: Works by some of the most celebrated modern and contemporary South Asian artists will feature in two consecutive auctions by Saffronart this October. The October Live Auction will take place at Saffronart's Mumbai gallery on 13 October 2021 and features 40 exceptional works by modern masters such as Amrita Sher-Gil, Jamini Roy, S H Raza, Akbar Padamsee, M F Husain, and more. This is followed by the October Online Auction on 13-14 October 2021 on the Saffronart website, with a curated catalogue of 80 works of modern and contemporary South Asian art, folk and tribal art, as well as collectibles.

## OCTOBER LIVE AUCTION | MODERN INDIAN ART | 13 OCTOBER 2021

The October Live Auction is led by Amrita Sher-Gil's Portrait of Mother, circa 1930s (Lot 21, estimate: INR 10 – 15 crores; USD 1.38 – 2.08 million), a rare early work from the artist. This work stands out in Sher-Gil's oeuvre due to the uniqueness of its subject. Believed to be the only portrait of Marie Antoinette Gottesmann (Sher-Gil's mother) painted by Sher-Gil, it is indicative of the artist's tremendous talent and maturity when it came to portraiture and the treatment of the female subject in the frame.

# OCTOBER ONLINE AUCTION | MODERN AND CONTEMPORARY SOUTH ASIAN ART AND COLLECTIBLES | 13-14 OCTOBER 2021

The October Online Auction is led by **Tyeb Mehta's** *Untitled* (*Blue Bird*), **2007** (Lot 66), estimate: **INR 8** – **10 crores; USD 1.11** – **1.38 million**). This work is a vibrant acrylic on canvas depicting a blue bird in free fall and has its roots in Mehta's *Falling Figure* series, which he first began painting in the mid-1960s. Painted towards the end of his life, this work is indicative of Mehta's evolution as an artist and his use of monochromatic fields of colour and strong vertical lines in aid of his pictorial vocabulary.
